A city that has as glorious a past as is its present, seeped in history.

Though the article was meant for the Visiting Delegates who attended the 17th Triennial Conference- HORIZON, I would like to share it with my home District-301, in the ORBIT. The words came from my heart and I am sure most of you can relate to what I have penned. So here it goes.....

Firstly, I want to extend a very warm welcome to all the visiting delegates for the 17th Triennial Conference-HORIZON on behalf of our respected Association President Sunita Jain, my home District Chairman Dr. Manisha Kaushik and the galaxy of dignitaries and members of District-301 to our city beautiful- DELHI. Though most of you may have visited Delhi in earlier years, this Souvenir would be totally incomplete without an overview of Delhi, the heart of India.

A city of timeless beauty, grandeur and heritage- it goes back to centuries of history with its roots deeply embedded in mythology as Indraprastha, the legendary capital of the Pandavas in the Mahabharata, and it has records in history of having been ruled by dynasties such as Tomars, the Rajputs, the Mamluk or the Slave dynasty, the Khiljis, the Tughlaqs, the Sayyids, the Lodis, the Mughals and later the British before emerging as the proud capital of independent India. As it was home to so many monarchs, therefore each ruler left an indelible mark on the city shaping its architecture, culture and traditions.

The grandeur of the different sovereigns is etched in Delhi's landscape through magnificent monuments like the Qutub Minar built in the 12th century, Humayun's Tomb that some say was an inspiration for the Taj Mahal, the Red Fort, the colonial architecture of the Rashtrapati Bhavan, the imposing war memorial India Gate and many many more.

There are many Spiritual landmarks in Delhi - Temples like the ancient Kalkaji Temple, Chattarpur Temple, Jhandewala Mandir, Lakhmi Narayan Mandir, Akshardham Temple to name a few. Delhi holds a special place in Sikh history with some of the most important Gurudwaras in the world-Gurudwara Bangla Sahib, Gurudwara Rakabganj Sahib, Gurudwara Sisganj Sahib and Gurudwara Majnu ka Tila - each seeped in the history of Sikh religion and strangely enough has a following of









thousands of devotees from other religions. The Jama Masjid is one of the largest mosques in the country. The city also houses other famous mosques like Khirki Masjid, Jamali Kamali, Hazrat Nizamuddin Dargah etc. Some historical churches are Sacred Heart Cathedral, St. James Church, St. Thomas Church and Cathedral Church of the Redemption. We have the Lotus Temple of the Baha'i house of worship and the famous Buddhist Tibetan Monastery, the Shanti Stupa and the Cambodian Monastery. These are just a few of the famous religious sites of Delhi.

It became a city where traditions blended seamlessly with modernity- a unique blend of the old and new. While old Delhi (or Purani Dilli as it is called) remains a labyrinth of narrow alleys and the bustling Chandni Chowk bazaar, New Delhi has sprawling and lush green spaces like the Lodhi Gardens, Talkatora Garden, Buddha Jayanti Park, Nehru Park, National Rose Garden, The Deer Park, and the newer Garden of 5 senses. It is simply impossible for me to include every famous monument, historical religious place or garden because the city has a surplus of everything- be it history, famous places, prestigious institutions, industry, religious sites, population, food, markets, designers just about anything and everything.

For me the city Delhi is not just a city- it is an emotion and I get amazed when I see it continues to evolve while keeping its soul intact- Honouring its past while embracing the future. The city is also a paradise for food lovers- from the irresistible chaat of local vendors, to the indulgence of the authentic flavours of Mughlai, Punjabi and street foods as well as some of the best world cuisines you name it and it's available. It is also the country's vibrant cultural capital where art, music, literature and theatre flourish.

Delhi welcomes all with open arms just as we the members of District-301 welcome our Inner Wheel sisters and I'm sure when you experience the sun setting over the river Yamuna, casting its golden glow on the domes and minarets, you too will feel the magic of this eternal city - a city that has lived through time yet remains ageless.

### A Journey Through Cities, A search for Home

It is so important to love where you live—otherwise, it leaves you feeling listless and dissatisfied. I have lived in a few cities, each culturally diverse and distinct from the other. Each time, I grew to adjust, feel at home, and develop a sense of belonging.

I was born in Guwahati and lived a sheltered, privileged life throughout my school years. My world revolved around our large home, my family, my elder siblings (I being the youngest), my school, my friends, and, most importantly, my books. Books opened the doors of the world for me. I romanticized the idea of staying in a boarding school, longing to escape the humdrum of my familiar surroundings. Eventually, I convinced my family to send me away for my undergraduate studies to Chandigarh and I soon found myself at Government College for Girls.

For a 16-year-old who had been pampered all her life, stepping into a hostel was nothing short of a shock. The girls there came from different backgrounds, cultures, and schools, but most had the advantage of a familiar face around —relatives, classmates, or friends. I, on the other hand, had no one. Evenings were often spent crying in the bathroom, homesick and overwhelmed, though I never let it show. Looking back, I sometimes think it was a blessing that we didn't have mobile phones back then. Communication with family was limited to occasional letters and brief phone calls, and I never let my sadness seep into them. Slowly, I adapted—learning the nuances of friendship, sharing, adjusting to hostel life, and navigating my new reality. A few months in, I found myself growing comfortable. Perhaps, if home had been just a call away, I might have given up too soon.

Time, as they say, is a great healer and teacher. I learned to share my space, my thoughts, and my life with newfound friends. The friendships forged in those formative years became my lifelines, enduring through the decades. I fell in love with Chandigarh—the city of the late '70s and early '80s, with its charm, sprawling roads, and laid-back beauty. It was a time of newfound freedom—movies, dining out, managing studies, and growing independent. Today's generation may take such independence for granted, but for us, it was a transition shaped by the values instilled in us—values that I carried forward into my own children's upbringing.

Each time I returned home from the hostel, I cherished the comfort of home, only to soon start missing my college, my friends, and the city I had come to love. Chandigarh, however, is no longer the city I once knew. The quiet student town of the past has transformed into a bustling metropolis, one I can no longer relate to.









After my four years of undergraduate studies, I traveled to the U.S. with my mother, staying almost a year with my elder siblings. From mid-1982 to April 1983, I experienced a new world—exploring different cities, cuisines, and cultures. From New York to San Francisco, from summer to snow, I embraced it all. By the time I returned to India, Guwahati felt too quiet, too slow. A restless longing set in. By June, I knew I had to return to Chandigarh. With some convincing, I secured my place in the postgraduate program for English Literature at Punjab University. Though I was now a year junior to my college friends, the transition was seamless, as they had already paved the way for my comfort.

Those two years at the university flew by, deepening the friendships that still stand strong today. But as I packed up to teary farewells and took my final flight home, I couldn't shake off a sense of uncertainty. After seven years away (returning home only for vacations), I felt like a rudderless boat. In our world back then, pursuing a career wasn't an expectation—especially for someone from my background. We adapt, grow, and make a place for ourselves. Imphal became home, and with the arrival of my two beautiful children, my world changed again. Just as I settled, fate intervened, and after 12 years, I was uprooted once more—this time, to Delhi.

Delhi was never part of my plans. Our house here had always been empty, and I had never felt any attachment to it. The city had been nothing more than a transit point throughout my life. I felt like an outsider, struggling to find my bearings in its vast expanse. With a frequently traveling husband and two young children, the task seemed daunting. But Delhi has a way of pulling you in. Slowly, it embraced me, and I, too, surrendered to its charm.

Despite the traffic snarls, the sweltering summers, the freezing winters, and the never-ending chaos, Delhi became home. No other city, not even my birthplace, has held me for as long as this one. The Northeast will always be my roots, a place of nostalgia and warmth—a place where I can still taste the flavors of my childhood and feel the peace of simpler times. But my heart now belongs to Delhi.

Home isn't just where you come from; it's where you grow, where you love, where you build a life. And for me, after years of wandering, Delhi is home.
